

(such as the departments of Botany and Agronomy) asking for further accommodation for research work. Hence it is impossible to utilise or adapt any rooms in any of these three buildings for residence purposes.

The proposal made that the men students be moved from their present residence into the temporary dormitory in the Main Building is not practicable. We have accommodation in the Main Building for about 36, and the figures given above will show the impossibility of housing 110 persons in the Main Building.

Further, I wish to point out that the south-east end of this flat, in which this dormitory is situated, is occupied by two members of the Household Science staff, and the students in the School of Household Science have to come and go to this practice house, or apartment, all the time. Hence, it would be an impossible arrangement to place men in this temporary dormitory accommodation.
