The most healthy stables are those which are open to the east, or have an eastern aspect—it is a common practice to build them too close—The stable should never be completely closed up, however cold the weather may be, although it is desirable that strong draughts of cold or damp air should be guarded against, especially in winter. It may be held as a general rule, that stables or cow houses are too close when on entering the breath is affected, or any smell of urine can be perceived. It is also very important to keep cow-houses, or cattle stables clean and well littered. Dung left in stables soon renders the air unwholesome, and is the cause of disorders. Colts are usually foaled about the beginning of Summer, and it is the custom to let them
