

GRAIN PRICES INCLINED TO SAG

Disappearance of Demand for Wheat for Export Discouraged Bulls.

CHICAGO, Feb. 18.—Flattening out of export business today took the edge off the market for wheat. Prices at the close were steady but 1-8 to 3-8c down, oats off 1-8 to 1-4c, and provisions varying from unchanged to a decline of 2-1/2 to 5c.

Beginning of the corn harvest in Argentina, implying shipments of the new crop from that country, had a bearish influence on the price of wheat. So also did news of cheap offers of Danubian corn to be shipped at New York. Assurances of arrivals were being likely to diminish in amount of rains clogging country roads, had only a temporary effect, and there was no lasting result other than the fact that shipping demand had somewhat improved.

Covering by shorts gave oats at first an appearance of independent strength. In the end, however, the market suffered a setback with other grains.

Buyers backed away from provisions because of the weakness in receipts. Influence of holders was somewhat unsettled, but by the increase shown in hog-packing since November 1, as compared with a year ago.
