A treatise on the life and death of Jesus Christ in the Mexican dialect used in Guatemala.

The above is the heading of the text on the first numbered leaf. "Al Lector" appears on the preceding leaf.

See Brasseur de Bourbourg's "Bibliothèque Mexico-Guatémaliennne," 1871, p. 141. The Brasseur de Bourbourg-Pinart copy, now at JCB., is the only one known.

Medina in his "Imprenta en Guatemala," no. 1082, gives a longer imprint and includes it in the eighteenth century publications.
