SUFFRAGE EXTENSION IN BRITAIN.

Next session of the British Parliament will be at once the most momentous and stirring for many years. Three measures of supreme importance will be introduced and forced thro the house of commons no matter what their fate may be when they reach the house of lords.

The prime minister sprung a surprise on parliament and the country when he announced that a manhood suffrage bill would be introduced. The proposal itself was not new, had indeed been part of the Liberal platform for years.

Wheat prices in England for six centuries are shown in the current issue of the crop report of the department of agriculture. This is not given in the report as news, explains The Washington Star, but is one of the curious bits of information occasionally incorporated in the periodical.

The record begins in the decade from 1261 to 1270. Wheat was then fifteen cents a bushel, and it continued with slight variation under twenty-five cents a bushel till 1520. The highest point reached in the intervening time was twenty-two cents, in 1561.

From this high point there has been a decline in prices ever since, till in the decade from 1871 to 1880 the price had fallen to \$1.08. In the past two decades prices have ranged from eighty-five to ninety cents a bushel, the present trend being upward.

MONTREAL, Nov. 29.—The export livestock trade from the port of Montreal for the season 1911 was brought to a close to-day by the sailing of the steamship Montreal of the Canadian Pacific Line, with 516 head of cattle for London. The season has been a very disappointing one, as the total number of cattle exported has been the smallest for the last 29 years, or since 1882.


