Will Limit Magistrates' Powers Concering Indefinite Sentences.

Legislation that will affect in many ways industrial refuges for females in Onttario is now before the legistry of the hearing of cases in private. lature. Heretofore it was permitted these institutions without judicial

The main object of the new act is to take care of these obvious dis-crepancies. Hereafter magistrates will only be permitted to sentence emales to these institutions for an indeterminate period not exceeding two years. The inspector is given power to parole inmates upon such conditions as may be deemed proper, and it will be necessary for the superintendents to keep records of the conduct of inmates with a view to permitting them to be released on parole.
