Bank of Montreal's statement for the six months ending April 30, issued to-562.90, compared with \$781.960.40 for the corresponding period of 1905. These profits, with the balance of profit and account, carried over from October, 1905, gives a total of \$1,642,418.31. From this sum two quarterly dividends of 2 1-2 per cent. on the capital stock sum of \$665,156.41 was left for this

purpose last year. Interest-bearing deposits increased during the half year about \$5,250,000, deposits not bearing interest by \$4,-000,000, a total increase of almost \$10,-000,000 over 1905.


