

> TRANSMITTING MONEY BY POST. The current number of The Cosmopolitan recommends the establishment of a national clearing house bank in the United States for the purpose of enabling the people to transmit cheaply small amounts of money that the cost of collecting country cheques exceeds \$1,300,000 per annum for the New York banks alone. The object of the proposed bank is to reduce this expense to a minimum. The scheme is founded upon a system prevailing in Austria-Hungary. In the latter it is a Government enterprise. It is proposed to eliminate Government control so as to make it conform to United States ideas. The writer of the article claims that 3 8-10 cents would be the total cost connected with the sending and collection of a cheque through the proposed clearing house bank.
