Investigation of Aberdeen Chambers Blaze Will Be Held in City Hall.

CLEARLY INCENDIARISM

Fire-Bug Takes Great Pains to Get Conflagration Started.

Just as soon as the police obtain information in connection with the fire that occurred during the early hours of yesterday morning in the Aberdeen Chambers, Adelaide Victoria streets, Provincial Fire Marshal E. P. Heaton will open a court of enquiry at the city hall. The fire was the work of a fire-bug and so well was the incendiarism organized that the building was completely gutted with a loss of several thousand dollars. No definite estimate of the amount of damage done has yet been made. Thomas Hollwey of the firm of Hollwey and Stinson, brokers, who own the building, stated last night that architects would be asked to look over the building today, and in his opinion it will be at least two days before the total loss will be known. Fire Chief Smith estimated the damage at \$16,000, \$10,000 to the building, and \$6000 to the contents.

The total insurance on the building, however, amounts to \$80,000, \$70,000 of which is carried on the building and the remaining \$10,000 on the

Saturated With Oil. The ruilding is a four-storey one and the second and third floors, which are partitioned off into small offices, were saturated with oil. On each of these floors large candles, about ten inches in length, were placed on wooden stands soaked in oil. Close to each of these stands was placed a quantity of shavings and pieces of wood that became ignited as the candles burned down and caused fire to gain great headway. When the fire was discovered the flames were shooting thru-the top of the roof and it was a very spectacular fire to watch. Police and fire department officials are amazed at the work of the fire-bug and stated that it was he worst case of arson in their recol-
