THE RIGHT REVEREND THE LORD BISHOP AND THE SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF FREDERICTON.

Committee of Synod appointed at the last meeting of the Synod under the following resolution, that is to say: Resolved, That this Synod regards it as a solemn duty to record its opinion that sound religious instruction is the true foundation of a proper system of education for the young, and at the time has now arrived when an earnest effort should be made on the part of the Church, to establish schools in which the principles of the Church shall be instilled in combination with secular teaching:—

Therefore further Resolved, That a Committee be now appointed to report to this Synod at its next meeting the best means of carrying into effect the views expressed in the foregoing resolution."
