North Sydney, N. S., Nov. 4-All hope of ever seeing the Newfoundland fishing schooner Orion, with her captain and en off Battle Harbor, when she was eaving for Grand Banks, her home port. Shortly after the Urion sailed a terrible southwest gale sprung up, which wrought such havor to the fishing crait. Since then fierce gales have swept the coast and in ne of them the Orion is believed to have gone down with all hands. The vessel was owned by George Buffett of Grand Banks, and commanded by Edward Evans. All the crew, with few exceptions leave wives and large families.
