Chicago, Sept. 30.—The race of Indians is no longer a dying race, Cato Sells, United States commissioner on Indian affairs, announced here on his return after an inspection trip through western Indian reservations. "The Indian problem was changed recently and the red man is looming up as a race which will hold its own," Mr. Sells said. "A vigorous health campaign was begun among them three years ago, and has brought forth amazing results. The Indian is rapidly becoming a producer of wealth instead of a mere consumer."
