Several guests were present, including Attorney General Baxter and J. A. Barry. Hon. H. O. McInerney, dean of the faculty; Dr. J. R. Campbell, secretary, and Judge Armstrong sent communications expressing their regret in not being able to attend.

An address was read by Thomas Sweeney and handed to Lt. Smith. Mr. Sweeney referred to the good work accomplished in the society by the retiring president. The deep interest he had displayed, the activity he had shown and the genial disposition with which he went about his work, had helped materially the law student's society. Lt. Smith said that it was the help and assistance he had received from the other members which had made it a pleasure for him to occupy the chair and he made a most genial chairman. W. E. McMonagle addressed a few remarks to the graduates of last year.
