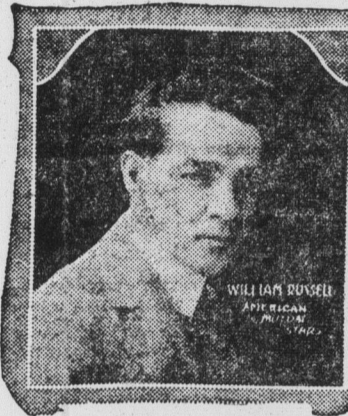


MISKE MAY GET FIRST CHANCE AT DARCY
