FREDERICTON, Oct. 29.—The word of the decisive victory of the University of New Brunswick rugby team over Acadia at Wolfville today was received with a yell by the big crowd of U. N. B. undergrads who gathered to receive the first word. U. N. B. yells echoed through the streets and many citizens got the idea it was election news.

The score is the largest ever run up in a shutout game by either college in the long series between them and it makes football history in being the first victory ever won at Wolfville by U. N. B.

REPORT R. R. BOUGHT CAUSES MAINE STIR

Deal Speculative One Only, However, so Far as Bangor Knows.

BANGOR, Me., Oct. 29.—Reports that a syndicate of western capitalists had obtained control of the Bangor & Aroostook Railroad by the purchase of the New York stock exchange of 44,000 of the 77,000 shares of common stock created something of a flurry here. In the absence of President Todd local officials pointed out that preferred shares have equal voting rights and the purchase does not mean the control. So far as known here the deal was in the open market for speculative purposes only and may have been unloaded by this time. There has been no indication of any western syndicate or any other syndicate showing an interest in obtaining the Bangor & Aroostook or buying any preferred shares.


