

## Striking Sydney Steel Men Vote To Resume Work

### TWO HAPPY EVENTS AT GOLDEN GROVE

Mr. and Mrs. E. P. Harrington of Golden Grove were pleasantly surprised last evening when about forty relatives and friends gathered at their home in honor of the fortieth anniversary of their wedding. They were received with the hospitality which has always marked this respected household and all had a jolly time with a bounteous repast, music and dancing. ### Strong Condemnation Voiced in Resolution Passed by Workers.

Sydney, N. S., Aug. 1.—By the terms of a resolution passed this evening at a meeting of the steel workers at Union headquarters about sixty-five per cent. of the striking steel men voted to return to work and the officers of the Union were authorized to notify the company to that effect. The resolution carried strong condemnation of the people, courts, police, newspapers, Provincial and Federal Governments for the stand taken by them and complained that every man's hand was against the strikers.

The steel company announced today that out of about 3,450 men normally employed at the plant some 2,805 were now working. The strike of the steel men has lasted since June 27. They struck for a twenty per cent. increase in wages and the introduction of the "check-off" system which would involve recognition of their union.

The resolution adopted at tonight's meeting reads: "Whereas, the steel workers of the British Empire Steel Corporation, having struck work on June 27, 1923, for the purpose of enforcing their demands for a living wage and a check-off of union dues, neither of which matters the corporation was prepared to negotiate before the strike but refused unconditionally;

"And since the strike commenced the workers have been fought by all the power of Federal and Provincial Governments, the corporation and the press, machine guns, bayonets, and the provincial police have been used against us to cow us; unrestricted prosecutions have been commenced in the courts against our members and bail refused them to break their spirit;

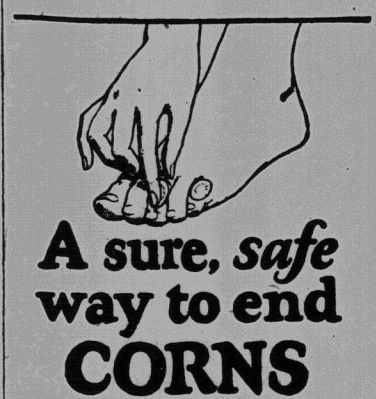

### Legless Train Victim Admits Killing Bride

Dr. Salomon Says U.S. Is Woman's Paradise

Pittsburgh, Aug. 2.—Tortured by the vision of his child-wife falling dead at his feet with a bullet hole through her temple, Patrick Coyne, a railroad man in the West Penn Hospital with both his legs cut off above the knees as the result of falling under a train, has cleared the mystery surrounding the finding of the nude body of his wife, Julia, aged 18, in bed in their "honeymoon cottage" at Port Perry nearly two weeks ago.

Coyne said his wife was shot while they were scuffling for the possession of a revolver, after he had repudiated her for staying in bed and "neglecting" him, while he "worked hard to support" her.

He picked up the body of "the child," he said, removed her flimsy undergarments, washed the body, placed it in bed, covered it up, left the house and
