

## TRouble FOR N. S. LIQUOR BOARD

Social Service Council to Ask  
for Investigation of Ship-  
ments.

Sydney, N. S., Aug. 18.—That the new Nova Scotia vendition commission has trouble on its hands early in its existence transpired yesterday when Rev. J. H. Hamilton announced that the Social Service Council intends to ask an investigation into the shipment by the commission of twenty barrels of liquor to a New Waterford physician for medical purposes. The shipment never arrived.

"We cannot allow the vendition commission to ship indiscriminate quantities of liquor here without knowing that it is going to be put to legitimate uses," declared Mr. Hamilton.

## AVES SEVEN IN STORM ON LONG ISLAND SOUND

Two Men in a Skiff Rescue Two Other  
Men and Five Children Afloat.

Stamford, Conn., Aug. 18.—George Savigan, a superannuated policeman, and Frank Waas, a chauffeur of this city, faced a raging sea in Long Island Sound to save two men and five children who were being driven in a row-boat out in the Sound in a furious thunder and lightning storm.

Frederick Phytaka of Stamford and John Rouke of New York City, together with five small children, went out in the row-boat to fish. They were a mile off shore when the storm broke. Phytaka and Rouke overboarded, and the little boat was tossed about in the high sea. Phytaka stood up to wave his coat as a signal for help, but fell into the water. He managed to reach the side of the boat, however, and Rouke pulled him in.

Meantime the signal had attracted the attention of Gavigan and Waas, who rowed a skiff and rowed out. They rescued the helpless occupants of the boat, lost to their own and brought them safely ashore.

## AKES NO CHANCES OF MISSING HIS MARK

Man Gets Physician to Indicate His  
Heart Before Shooting Self.

Port Jervis, N. Y., Aug. 18.—"Doctor, have always had a curiosity to know just where my heart is located," said Herbert Crawford, a retired New York merchant, who had called on Dr. Glatzmeier for a simple ailment. The physician had been applying a stethoscope to the chest of the patient, to oblige him, took a pencil and drew a circle in his body around the location of his heart.

While Dr. Glatzmeier was writing a prescription, Crawford excused himself, went into an adjoining room and shot himself in the exact centre of the circle the doctor had drawn, dying instantly. No reasons have been assigned for the suicide.

## LANDLORD CUTS RENTS.

Man Sees an Indication of a General  
Reduction.

Boston, Aug. 18.—Found at last—the landlord who has reduced rents of his own volition. Tra Shapira, who controls 40 apartments in all sections of Boston, back to prewar rentals.

"Any landlord can do it," he said. "They are robbers if they don't, and deserve what they'll get. I'm going to lead this fight in the reduction of rents. The other landlords have been raising a lot of words about what they were going to do. I'm doing it right away. My rents are down and I have ordered them to be cut still more."

"My agents yesterday told me they could rent my places for \$50. I told them \$40 was enough. I have been following the game for twenty-five years, and I predict the landlord who does not cut his rentals will go down in a crash."

Herbert Ellis, Chairman of the Mayor's Rent and Housing Commission, said today that Shapira's action was the first favorable indication that rents were coming down generally.

## DIES TAKING KITE OFF WIRE.

New York, Aug. 18.—Automobile thefts in New York have almost doubled in the past six months, according to police figures for the boroughs of Manhattan and Bronx. Since February 20, 2,491 cars, valued at \$2,500,000, have been stolen.




