WOODSTOCK'S CUT

IN THE TAX RATE

(Woodstock Press.)

At a meeting of the town council on Friday night R. F. Armstrong, the town manager, announced that the tax rate for Woodstock this year, as arrived at by the board of assessors, who have just completed the compilation of the valuation, is \$1.70 on \$100, a reduction of twenty cents on each \$100 compared with last year when this town had the lowest rate of any town in the maritime provinces of equal population.
