SUGAR PRICES

ARE WEAKENING Retail merchants in the city dropped the price of sugar two cents a pound yesterday and were offering that precious commodity at twenty-five and twenty-four cents per pound. Retail grocers have not generally been regarded as philanthropists and yet some of them must belong to that class. The wholesale grocers quoted sugar at unchanged rates yesterday. They were offering sugar for \$24.10 per hundred pounds. The refineries gave their rates as twenty-four cents per pound for sugar in wholesale quantities. All this notwithstanding, there was at least one grocer who offered to sell a 100 pound bag of sugar at \$22. Another grocer fixed his price for the same sized bag at \$24.50. The grocers are preparing for a drop in prices and are more anxious about the situation than the wholesalers and refineries appear to be.


