

cialship Endowment Fund to \$20,000 and to raise the Mountain Professorship of Pastoral Theology to \$25,000. This will require something like \$4,000 more than is already subscribed.

It is urgently hoped that this sum may be speedily forthcoming to add to the two Funds, marked C and E in the "Form of Subscription."

NOTE.—The Ten Thousand Dollars, required to secure Twenty Thousand offered by Robert Hamilton, Esq., D.C.L., was secured on June 3, 1896; since that date the Hon. E. J. Price has promised \$5000. On June, 1, 1897, the Jubilee fund stood at \$42,600, including \$5,000 from the late J. H. R. Molson, Esq., besides the £1000 promised by the S.P.C.K. and the \$2000 promised by Dr. Mountain. To secure the offer of the S.P.C.K. the sum of \$4,000 is still required.
