

The London Times contains an account of experiments at Shoeburyness on Tuesday with a gun of large size and great calibre, which (says the Times) "showed at every discharge that our best and hitherto considered invulnerable forms of ironides were, so to speak, almost as easily penetrated by shot as if the targets had been of timber."
