Dr. Hermann Robertson, medical health officer, has handed the appended letter to the Times for publication. is dated December 20th, and has, therefore, been before the board of health for ten days. Dr. Robertson says his letter has elicited no reply nor has he been informed that any definite action is promised in the immediate future. He feels that, in justice to himself, the public should b nade aware that he, as officer in charge of the welfare of the city in espect to measures for the protection health, has done every thing in his power to place the affairs of the Isoation hospital on a proper basis, and has therefore asked the Times to publish the letter which is as follows:


