LAURIER PROMISES TWO BIG PROJECTS

Hudson Bay Ry. and Georgian Bay Canal

Foreshadow Appointment of Commission on Laurier—Important Campaign Addresses at Ottawa.

OTTAWA, Jan. 24.—Sir Wilfred Laurier addressed a largely attended meeting in the Russell Theatre last night in the interests of the Liberal candidate, Albert Abbot. He spoke of the Government's position on the national question and of the opposing criticisms made against it by the opposition.
