THE POOR RETAILER

The owners of retail stores, restaurants and service establishments generally, in our smaller cities and towns throughout the Dominion. In Parliament we hear of the woes of the farmer, and as for the manufacturer the nembers wail upon him hand and foot, and when he whispers that his pocketbook is getting empty and he would like to take a little more out of the pockets of the consumers, there are always of the consumers, there are always willing sycophants eager to do him

nonour.

For a great many years we have had a complete record of the doings of the manufacturers We knew the number of men employed, the wages paid, the amount of raw material and the value of the product produced. Naturally with the undue empassis placed upon this feature of our economic life we reached the conclusion that the manufacturers were tremendously important, and that retail merchants and other local institutions were more or less

that retail merchants and other lo-eal institutions were more or less dust under the feet of the mighty. Now, the Dominion Bureau of Sta-tistics has been making a consus of retailers and it contains some very interesting facts. In the larger cities the big industrial centres, the ma-nufacturers are of course much more important than the retailers so far as employment is concerned, but as employment is concerned, but when one considers the smaller cities, the story is reversed and in the towns and villages manufacturing is insignificant and retail and service establishments are very important.

The burden of the present depression falls with deadly force upon that section of our community dedifes and the rendering of service in comparaison with the selling price of basic commodities then retail trade is stifled and the small town languishes. The larger distributing agencies, the chain stores and departmental stores with ample ressources, survive in the struggle and the local merchant is crushed to the wall. Extreme tariffs destroy the forces of competiton, encourage monopoly, lead to the concentration of wealth in the hands of a few, and to he condition of unemployment which in the hands of a few, and to he condition of unemployment which we have today. In this realignment of our national life the worst sufferers are farmers and labourers and that very large section of our community engaged in the distribution of commodifies. The local merchants of Canada should awake to the fact that they are the losers when high trainfir restrict the purchasing power of the community. They are an important element of the nation—their voices should be heard September, 1932.
