MINISTERS IN NEW BRUNSWICK AND P. E. ISLAND GIVEN INCREASES

—Rev. Thomas Marshall Here From Ottawa Gives Details Of Meeting—Apportionments \$50,000 More Than Last Year—Missionary Going To China.

Rev. Thomas Marshall, superintendent of missions of the Methodist church for the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland passed through the city yesterday, returning from the meeting of the general board of missions of the Methodist church which was held in Ottawa from Oct. 7 to 13.

The Apportionments. The apportionments for this year were fixed at approximately \$639,000. This is \$50,000 more than the income of last year and means that much more will have to be raised.

The Apportionments are as follows: Home department, which includes domestic missions and work among the immigrants \$255,903; Indian work, \$111,904; Japanese work in Canada, \$28,749; in Japan, \$58,465; Chinese work in British Columbia, \$4,310; in China, \$123,918; Young people's work, \$13,907; Circuit expenses, \$6,850; chairman's expenses, \$1,787; allocations and support of missions, \$2,000; publishing reports, etc., \$6,200; interest, etc., \$3,800; grants to supernumerary ministers, \$700; grants to supernumerary ministers, \$4,222; interest on fees, \$250; annuities, \$2,300; interest on legacies, \$3,500; expense of board meetings, contingent charges, travelling expenses, etc., \$15,500; miscellaneous grants, \$1,832.
