MEMBERS OF THE PROVINCIAL REPRESENTATION

Continued from page 2. Prince Edward Island, which has been reduced from six to four members, will see by almost on the vanishing point. The people of New Brunswick can't view this state of affairs with complacency. It is a source of injury to the national pride that the people of New Brunswick should be reduced to four members of the Dominion of Canada should be limited in representation down until in the next twenty or thirty years it will be not more than one half the present number. Large areas have been added to Quebec and Ontario and the western provinces, but New Brunswick is so situated that its boundaries cannot be extended for on one side the Atlantic ocean and on the other the United States.

A Strong Case

He believed that a strong case in favor of the confederation of New Brunswick and the other Maritime Provinces rested in the fact that the Northwest Territories, which had been bought with the money that had been raised in the Maritime Provinces originally in confederation, had been given to western provinces and now it was being used for the extension of the Dominion of Canada to the province of New Brunswick and the Maritime Provinces cannot be extended and no compensation has been given to the Maritime Provinces in exchange therefor. The people of the Maritime Provinces cannot afford to look on with complacency and see their representation reduced. In the case of the province of British Columbia, the principle of an irreducible minimum in the representation of the province of British Columbia can never fall below six.

The Case of P. E. Island

In 1871 Prince Edward Island joined Confederation and the public men of that province realized that they would not have been justified in resigning their seats in the Union unless there was an irreducible minimum of representation provided for them. As had been done in the case of British Columbia, in the provinces where there was such a provision, for one of those who attended the conference returned to Prince Edward Island and said it was arranged that that province should have at least six representatives. Prince Edward Island had its six representatives and continued to live there during the entire lifetime of Sir John A. Macdonald, who seemed to realize the fairness of the claims of that province. Finally the province was taken before the courts and the decision was that while it was the intention, no doubt, from evidence that the province should have six representatives as British Columbia, nevertheless the act was not properly worded to make that provision.

State Which Have Been Taken

A previous attorney general of this province who occupied a prominent position at the bar, held that the word "provinces" in the British North America Act meant only the four provinces in the original confederation. He carried the point to the Privy Council, and even the Privy Council decided that it had not been upheld by the Judicial Committee of that body. Continuing the Hon. Mr. Hazen said that while in Prince Edward Island last summer he had a conference with Premier Hazard, and the result was that he later had a conference with Mr. Palmer, one of the members of the Prince Edward Island legislature. Mr. Warburton, who had moved a resolution on the subject in parliament; Dr. Daniel, of St. John, who had seconded the resolution in parliament; and Hon. Mr. McLean, attorney general of Nova Scotia, the result of which was that Mr. Hazard, as the senior of the three premiers of the maritime provinces, asked Sir Jas. Whitney and Sir Lomer Gouin to call a meeting of the premiers of the provinces of Canada. This was done and the Hon. the Prime Minister of Canada held that confederation was a compact between the several provinces, and before he could ask to have the British North America Act changed by the Privy Council, it would have to be as the result of resolutions passed by the premiers of the provinces of the Dominion.

THE CENTRAL RAILWAY

The bill relating to the New Brunswick Coal and Railway Company was considered. Hon. Mr. Fleming said that a fire had occurred at the roundhouse in Chipman. The roundhouse was destroyed and two engines in the house at the time were considerably damaged. While the roundhouse was insured, there was no insurance on the engines. The bill empowered the Government to borrow a sum sufficient to cover the loss and purchase new engines. The bill was agreed to.

Mr. Robinson's Second

Mr. Robinson in rising to second the resolution said it gave him great pleasure to see that the bill had passed every word spoken by his hon. friend, the attorney general. A good argument in favor of our Maritime Provinces was made by the fact that the Maritime Provinces were hemmed in by the ocean, the state of Maine and Quebec and had no room for territorial expansion had been the other provinces. He thought the press of the Maritime Provinces without regard to politics should give free expression to their feelings. Everybody in these provinces regardless of their political leanings, should take a deep interest in preserving their representation in the Federal government.

There must be a warm and united effort

on the part of all parties in these provinces in bringing about the desired results. In construction of matters affecting the Dominion there had been a tendency to forget the rights of the Maritime Provinces. Instances of this were afforded in the matter of the Intercolonial Railway and fisheries. It seemed to him very necessary that every effort should be made by the province to see that we receive justice. We could not obtain our just rights without united and wholehearted effort.

He knew the Opposition members

of the House would give their best assistance in the endeavor to obtain for the Maritime Provinces the rights as regarded representation. It had been said that the Maritime Provinces should be united and Gaspé Peninsula included in the union. It was only right, he said, that Gaspé territory should be added, in return for the proposed large extension of the boundaries of Quebec. He had been deeply impressed with the idea of a union of the Maritime Provinces and felt it would result in a great benefit to all concerned. There was too much pomp and show practised at present in the attempt on the part of each province to initiate the proposed union. If united the provinces would have far more influence in maintaining their position as a prominent part of the Dominion of Canada.

The House went into committee

with Mr. Sproule in the chair. Bills to amend the Game Act of 1909 and to amend the act in addition to the act respecting the imposition of certain taxes on certain incorporated companies and associations were agreed to. A Bridge Bill. Hon. Mr. Fleming introduced a bill to make further provision for permanent bridges, and works of a permanent character. He explained that in continuing the policy of permanent bridges which has been followed for several years, he had been urged in order to finish the work contracted for and authorized by law to be built to expend further sums amounting to \$1,100,000. There was no appropriation, which there was no appropriation. There was also provision for \$15,000 for the completion of those during the present year. The bill provided an expenditure under the bill of \$152,000. Hon. Mr. Fleming introduced a bill to amend the act respecting the solemnizing of marriages. The bill provided for the publication of banns of marriage and also to legalize the new form of marriage return to be forwarded by the officiating clergyman to the division registrar. Mr. Slipp presented the petition of Robert L. Duncan and others in favor of the incorporation of the Province of New Brunswick was agreed to. The bill to incorporate the Tracadie Room Company, further relating to the town of Campbellton, to authorize the Roman Catholic Bishop of Chatham to convey the interest of the said corporation in certain lands in the county of Miramichi, and to authorize the town of Campbellton, and further relating to the town of Newcastle, were agreed to with amendments.
