

CELEBRATES ANNIVERSARY OF ORDINATION

Rev. F. J. McMurray, of
Woodstock, Receives Gift
from Parishioners — 25
Years a Priest.

Woodstock, N. B., Jan. 25.—Twenty-five years ago, in the Cathedral at St. John, Rev. F. J. McMurray, M.A., pastor of St. Gertrude's church, Woodstock, was ordained to the priesthood by the late Right Rev. John Sweeney, Bishop of St. John. Today being the anniversary of that solemn event his parishioners decided to fittingly celebrate the occasion. Rev. F. McMurray celebrated the high mass, while the sermon was preached by Rev. Fr. Walsh, C.S.B., St. John. At vespers the pastor was assisted by Rev. Fr. Walsh, Rev. Fr. Silko, of Houlton, and Rev. Fr. Murphy, of Debec, were also present.

After mass, His Honor Judge Carleton presented the pastor with a purse of \$300 in gold and read an eulogistic address referring to the dignity and honor of the priesthood, the affection in which he is held by his parishioners, and the citizens generally, and the material and spiritual progress in the parish during the last eight years, which can be equaled by very few parishes in the diocese.

Rev. Fr. Walsh, after preaching a very learned sermon, congratulated Rev. F. McMurray, first, on behalf of his parishioners, second on behalf of His Lordship Bishop LeBlanc, and the clergy of St. John, and lastly on behalf of the Catholic Church to which he had rendered excellent service for a quarter of a century.

Rev. Fr. McMurray said it was not easy to reply to the kind words of the learned judge and the eloquent preacher, which were the sentiments of generous hearts. Two-thirds of his life-time had been passed and he realized his personal unworthiness, but to God he would attribute such success as he had had.

He was ordained by the late Bishop Sweeney on Jan. 25, 1889. He was stationed in the Cathedral for 15 years, then two years as rector of the Cathedral and after the removal of Rev. Fr. Chapman to St. John, he came to Woodstock eight years ago, where he has spent the happiest years of his life.

He would pray for his parishioners and he asked them to pray for him until such time as both he and they would be called to enjoy the Beatific Vision forever.

Several congratulatory messages were received by Rev. Fr. McMurray today.

BARONESS BEING SUED BY AMERICAN PHYSICIAN

A \$30,000 pearl necklace belonging to a French-Canadian baroness and an American physician with an inflexible Monte Carlo "investment system" figured in a remarkable case which began in the law courts of London.

Dr. Ernest Villiers Appleby, the American medical man, has sued Baroness May de Pallandt for \$30,000 alleged to be due on two bills which he backed and on which he alleged the baroness agreed to indemnify him. The action arose out of a sale to the baroness by Dr. Appleby, a Paris jeweller, of a \$30,000 string of pearls.
