NOT A DEFEAT BUT A ROUT

THE Tories Almost Sweeping the English Counties

Home Rule to Date in a Minority of 113—Prospects of a Conservative Government—Mr. Balfour Secures a Victory in the West Division of Belfast.

LONDON, July 7.—Midnight—Up to this hour 287 Unionists, 119 Gladstonians and 50 Tories have been elected. The standing of the vote now is:

LONDON, July 7.—The last hope of the Gladstonians, the vote in the counties, has failed. The English counties are going Unionist. The counties of Somerset, West York, Hereford, Derby, Denbigh and Shropshire, in which centres the agricultural vote, have returned Conservatives. Scotland and the Gladstonians in the counties have not yet been taken, but it is impossible to reverse the defeat of the government. The Unionists are confident of an ultimate strength of 370 against 300. The Conservatives are certain that with a compact coalition of 300 members Lord Salisbury will form a purely Conservative ministry.

THE Battle in Ireland

CROP PROSPECTS BRIGHT

New York, July 7.—From over 4,000 crop reports from all parts of the country the Rural New Yorker concludes that the winter wheat crop in the whole pool, the probable yield being 225,000,000 bushels, against 212,000,000 bushels in 1885, with slight increase in acreage. Spring wheat has been considerably better than last year. The total wheat yield will probably be 430,000,000 bushels against 397,000,000 bushels last year. In oats there has been a slight increase in acreage. The crop will probably yield 900,000,000 bushels, against 820,000,000 bushels in 1885. Of rye and barley there will be an excellent crop. The crop of corn and the outlook is excellent for a fine crop. Of early potatoes the crop will be heavy. Late potatoes are promising. There has been a large increase in the area of cultivated grasses in the west and south, and considerable in clover.

Crops in the Northwest

St. Paul, Minn., July 7.—Reports from 950 points, covering 160 counties in the Northwest, show the condition of spring wheat to be much worse than a month ago. The drought in May followed by the hot and dry weather in June, has done much to injure the crop. The worst reports are from the Southern Minnesota, Southwestern Dakota and Nebraska. The crop in the Northwest will be from one-half to two-thirds of an average. The drought is also severe in northern Iowa. The crop promises a good crop so far. Oats are almost normal in the Northwest. The hay crop promises an average crop, but the barley crop will be the lightest for years.

The Step Crop a Failure
