

No. 5 ITS	30 Sep 1943		<p><u>SEMI-MONTHLY MEDICAL REPORT 16 to 30th Sept. 1943, inclusive</u></p> <p>Hospital admissions for the period: Station Sick Quarters 8 Trenton Station 1 Christie St. Hosp. 1 Notre Dame Hosp., Mont. 1</p> <p>At 1940 hours on 29 September 1943, AC2 Dewar, W.C. U 199179 was struck by an automobile just east of the ITS, suffering a compound fracture of the skull with cerebral haemorrhage and a compound fracture of the left tibia and fibula. He was admitted to Belleville General Hospital but died at 1300 hours 30 September 1943.</p> <p>Although there is an epidemic of Poliomyelitis in the Belleville area at the present time, no cases have occurred at this unit to date.
