with reference to correspondence regarding resignation of Mr. J. F. Callbreath, Acting Indian Agent at Telegraph Creek, and the appointment of some one to look after the Indians in that district, I beg to say that by an Order of His Excellency in Council, dated 2nd instant, Mr. George D. Cox, who has been Acting Agent for some time, has been appointed Indian Agent, at a salary of \$600 a year, at Telegraph Greek for what is to be known as the Stikine Indian Agency, comprising all that portion of the Cassiar District lying north of a line drawn east from the intercession of the international boundary and the Stikine river, his magisterial jurisdiction to cover the territory included in his Agency.

Kindly advise Mr. Cox accordingly and give him any necessary instructions.
