staff of worksen and to pay Indians as well for their services. The amount of assistance to be given for each house was based on a careful estimate of the cost of the material to be given. From Mr. Levis' occrespondence it is guthered that a certain portion of this Grant could be used for wages, and the authorizations the Department would not object to the engagement of a Foreman to essist the Indians. Wr. Agent Lewis had no authority from the Department to engage a lerge staff of men.

No unrecessary work should be undertaken this winter and at the same time we should be prepared to prevent suffering or hardship if at all possible, even when it has arisen from the action of the Indiana themselves in parting with their holdings at an inconventent time.

Mindly instruct Mr. Sermons to deal with this matter promptly and orlaustively, and in enquiring into the subject he should have me the oc-operation of Agent Lewis.
