

before for right of way, consideration to be
 had of the increased value that will be
 given to any lands through or over which
 the railway will pass, by reason of the
 passage of the the railway through or over
 the same, or by reason of the construction
 of the railway; and shall set off the in-
 creased value that will attach to the said
 lands or grounds against the incumbrance,
 loss, or damage, that might be suffered or
 sustained, by reason of the Company taking
 possession of, or using the said lands;
 and if he did not have regard to the
 said provisions, request him to amend his
 valuation accordingly.
