Q. You know the lot owned by George Irvine on the east side of the river with John Cochran living on the south side of him? A. Yes, I know him.

Q. Did you know such a lot to be occupied by George Irvine any time in that neighborhood of the treaty or transfer?

A. Well, it was not him that occupied the land before the transfer and at the time of the transfer.

Q. Do you know of this George Irvine occupying any other lot but this one?

A. No, I just remember that he was occupying this lot.

Q. Bounded on the north by John Cochran? A. Yes.

Q. When was he living on this lot?

A. Well, he never lived on it.
