

- Q. 180 Well, to refresh your memory in this form, in this statement: "I hereby engage to serve wherever I am required to and in any capacity for three years effective from 1 Oct 1946". That is rough, you remember that? What rank did you have then?
- A. 180 WO II Sir.
- Q. 181 In the Army, before you went on this Winter Training Course in Valcartier, what was your normal station?
- A. 181 In Sherbrooke.
- Q. 182 That is roughly 102 miles south east of Montreal?
- A. 182 Yes, 100 - 102 miles.
- Q. 183 What is your normal residence?
- A. 183 1467 Joliette St., Montreal. I have lived there for the last 12 years.
- Q. 184 So your place of duty was Sherbrooke?
- A. 184 Right, Sir.
- Q. 185 Now from the second of March 1949 until the 6th of April 1949, from 0900 hours 2 March 1949 until 1600 hours 6 April 49, were you at your normal place of duty in Sherbrooke?
- A. 185 No, Sir.
- Q. 186 You were not?
- A. 186 No, Sir.
- Q. 187 Did you, between these two dates, perform any military service?
- A. 187 You mean the time I was AWL?
- Q. 188 Yes. Did you, between the 2 Mar 49 and 6 Apr 49 perform any military duty?
- A. 188 No, Sir.
- Q. 189 You did not?
- A. 189 No, Sir.
- Q. 190 I would like to refer the attention of the Court to exhibit "M" all the time you were away you were wearing military uniform?
- A. 190 Most of the time, Sir.
- Q. 191 When you went to the Deputy Notary in Montreal, to register your firm, were you in uniform?
- A. 191 No, Sir.
- Q. 192 You gave your occupation as being a travelling salesman?
- A. 192 That is right, Sir.
