Statement made by Mr. A Macdonald
Crofters and Steam Paiser L.M.S. residing
at East Hill Culloden moor the charge
against K-99014 Sgt Greenwood J.G.
This 5th day of November 1943

Between 1800 and 1900 hours on
Saturday 2 Oct 43 I gave Sgt. Greenwood
a one pound note as he had hinted to me
that he was broke. Then on Sunday night
he sent Pte McKee of No 7 company at about
2100 hours to my house to say that Sgt.
Greenwood wanted to see me at the camp
I went to the camp and met Sgt. Greenwood
who took me to another soldier who was
a carpenter and he asked me to take the
sugar which he had in three large tins at
the side of the road. I took it in my car
and Sgt Greenwood told me to put it
well out of sight. This was before I went
to work at twelve midnight. The carpenter
told me it was surplus sugar out of the
cook-house. On Mrs Greenwood leaving from
my house on Tuesday 5 Oct 43 she came
down with a case of jam to our sitting
room. She said she had something to
give for the rent and this jam is ~~part of~~
~~the payment of the~~ she said she had
more and had too much to take with her
and I said if I give you one pound for
the linoleum on the floor which had been put
on by Mrs Greenwood and free of the
week's rent would she be pleased she said
yes.
