The chief town of the county of Perth, and situated on the river Avon, at the five corners of the township of North Easthope, South Easthope, Downie, Gore of Downie, and Ellice. Stratford communicates with Toronto and the eastern cities by the Grand Trunk Railway, and with Buffalo, New York, and other cities in the United States, by the Buffalo and Lake Huron Railway, which has a station here. Stratford enjoys a large trade in lumber, flour, wheat, and other agricultural productions, besides her numerous manufactories of various kinds. Distant from Toronto 88 miles, Sarnia 80 miles, London (by St. Mary's) 39 miles, and from Goderich 45 miles. Mails daily. Population 2,746, by census of 1861.
