Mr. Fanning moved for leave to bring in a bill in amendment of an Act “ *For appointing Commissioners of Sewers.*”

Leave was given accordingly.

On motion made and seconded—

House in committee.

The House resolved itself into a committee to take into consideration “ *An Act for laying out, repairing and amending, Highways, Roads and Streets and for appointing Commissioners and Surveyors of Highways within the several Towns or Parishes in this Province,*” and the several Acts in addition to and in amendment and continuation of the same—

Mr. William Pagan in the chair.

The Speaker resumed the chair.

Report of the committee.

The chairman reported that the committee had gone into the consideration of the said Acts—and had directed him to report a progress—
