On Motion of Mr. Motgomery, Ordered, That the Bill, entitled "An "Act for raising a Fund for the purpose of destraying the necessary expenses, of the Members of the House of Assembly during their attendance "at the General Assembly of this Island," receive a second reading.

Ordered on Motion of Mr. Palmer, That the Papers relative to the late Committee of Correspondence be delivered to the Chairman of our present Committee of Correspondence.

Ordered on Motion of Mr. M'Aulay, That the Bill, entitled "An Act" concerning Land Surveyors and admeasurement of Land," receive a fecond reading.

Ordered on Motion, That the House resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House to resume the consideration of the Bill, entitled An Ast, to alter and amend an Ast, made and passed in the 42d year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled an Ast to alter and amend an Ast in addition to, and amendment of, an Ast, made and passed in the 35th year of his present Majesty's Reign, entitled an Ast to alter and amend the High Road Laws, Mr. C. Stewart, Jun. in the Chair.

After some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair and the Chairman reported progress, and desired leave to sit again.

The Committee appointed to wait on His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor with the Address of this House recommending Captain fohn M'Donald's Petition returned and reported, That His Excellency was pleased to say he would cheerfully agree with their desire.

The House adjourned till ten o'clck to morrow.
