BLIND JOHN ROBERTS. IS NOT CREDITED.

London, Aug. 29.—A special despatch from St. Petersburg contains the somewhat remarkable assertion that Russia, almost immediately, will notify the powers that she considers the relief of Pekin legations as the final accomplishment of the military task of the allied forces.

There is nothing to confirm this, however. They regard the activity of the allies at Pekin and the difficulty of discovering a responsible Chinaman, with whom to treat, unless Li Hung Chang is able to place himself in communication with the fugitive court and secure credentials satisfactory to all the powers, as indications that the solution of the problem will be more prolonged and more difficult than previously hoped.

TROOPS LANDED IN CHINA. Berlin, Aug. 29.—The German naval commander at Taku telegraphs that according to the returns asked for by the following troops have been landed up to August 18th: American, 155 officers and 4,470 men; British, 189 officers and 5,942 men; French, 115 officers and 2,903 men; Italian, 13 officers and 977 men; Japanese, 573 officers and 19,508 men; Russian, 275 officers and 11,906 men.

despatches from Chefoo announces that the telegraphic cable between Chefoo and Shanghai will be ready for traffic by September 7th. The commander of the German gunboat Jansar reports that communication with Pekin is still exposed to temporary interruption.

EARL LI'S CREDENTIALS. Latest Phase of the Diplomatic Tangle Over China.

Washington, D. C., Aug. 29.—The latest phase of the diplomatic tangle involving the powers now interested in China is the form of Li Hung Chang's credentials. The point of attack on the credentials is now the authority of the titular Chinese government to issue any credentials worthy of recognition.

In other words admitting that Li's credentials were properly issued by Emperor Kwang Hsu, the contention is that the monarch cannot, by himself or through his agent, Li Hung Chang, give any guarantee or engagement or give any guarantee which the Chinese people as a whole will accept as binding.

This subject is now receiving the careful attention of the secretary of state. Meanwhile Minister Wu and the department are in ignorance as to the whereabouts of Li Hung Chang and from him for four days at least, it is conjectured that he may have left Shanghai by sea and that he will appear in Taku and demand access to Pekin.

PARTITION OF CHINA. Russia, Germany and Japan Have Made Selections.

New York, Aug. 29.—Since Russia is quietly assimilating Chinese territory south of the Amur river, in some quarters it is thought that the landing of Japanese troops at Amoy is the Japanese answer to these Muscovite moves.

London, Sept. 1.—Some outsiders' critics here are beginning to recognize the outcome of the present crisis will eventually be that slices of Chinese territory will certainly pass into possession of Russia, Germany and Japan. The first named will seize Manchuria on the plea that China declared war and invited Siberia.
