LAURIER'S BUNCOMBER

"The reason we have taken attitude we have taken against this bill is to call the attention of House and of the country to most important measure, perhaps which has ever engaged its attention during the forty years of its existence. I suppose it is because it opens the way to new departure altogether in national life. This present hour this present day are not what we are, they are what we have become. We are turning our backs on the long and traditional history of this country since Confederation. We are passing this bill, we are interrupting and perhaps putting an end to the spirit of self-confidence, self-reliance which has made, and which it is to-day; if we do this, we are turning our backs on the long and faithful struggle which characterized colonial government from its inception to this day, the one side and expansion of other—a struggle which we had forever been settled in favour of colonial expansion."—Sir W. Laurier, in the Commons.
 Where on earth could you be above for absolute balderdash?
 Canadians in offering immediate assistance to the British navy are in any sense putting "an end to the spirit of self-confidence," but simply discharging an obligation over-due.
 The assertion that Canadian attention is involved in the swiftest of absolute banishment.
 Laurier knows that, and every sensible man knows it, but the truth is that he is hungry for the flesh of the office.
 The late Goldwin Smith, one of the foremost scholars of the world, in some reminiscences published after his death, referred to all the public men of the Dominion of Laurier.
 He evidently regarded him as an opportunist, which his career has shown him to be, and a future history will regard him as one who had made a move of nation or empire value which he has initiated, or espoused.

Obstruction and Reaction

The champions of Obstruction ranged on the side of Reaction. Mediaevalism against the forces make for peace, prosperity and progress. Doubtless they will deny. Perhaps they don't even realize their outlook is narrow and they cannot see beyond the pale limits of local party politics. Britain, whatever faults has been the Hampean of the nation, Her genius is commercial rather than military, but she always combined her commercialism with the power to protect her commerce. It is because Britain has put the prosperity of people first and has recognized her navy and military are but means to that end, that the flag of Britain never fails to evoke the enthusiasm of her sons.
 The two contending forces in Europe to-day are Modernism standing for free political institutions, government by the people, and universal standing for rule by a military aristocracy. Britain and her allies represent Modernism; Germany or rather the German Emperor and ruling classes represent mediaevalism.
 The Asquith government which presents the extreme anti-war party in England at first refused to recognize the gravity of the German advance, but for the last two years have been fully alive to it, and making every preparation to meet it. We could have no better proof, were wanted, of the necessity of every part of the Empire standing together ready to render mutual aid in this crisis than the fact that Liberal Government in England inherits the traditions of Hampean and Pym, of Bright and Cobden, sounded the old Cromwell cry "To your tents, Oh Israel!" and (not asked Canada to give immediate aid), has accepted the aid, and only so freely offered, supposing the offer was genuine. Who the members Sir Wilfrid's grandiose words when tending that aid wonder that Britain should supply the offer genuine. In the face of
