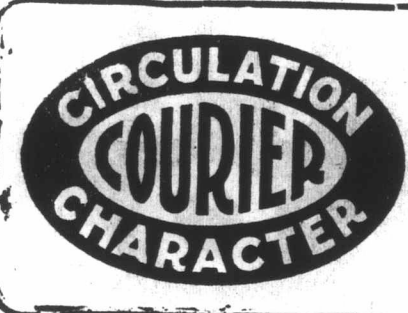

SAN DIEGO SUNK BY SUB?—NOT MINED?

Commander of Raiding U-Boat Boasted of Sinking of U. S. Cruiser

Portland, Me., Aug. 24.—A bet that the American cruiser San Diego was torpedoed and not mined, was made by the commander of the submarine which captured the steam trawler Triumph and used her as a raider on the fishing banks this week according to reports from Captain Myers of the Triumph today. The German officer also asserted that he sank the tank steamer O. B. Jennings was a prisoner on the submarine while Captain Myers was on board. A number of Boston, New York and Portland papers were taken from the Triumph and the commander said he had been much amused in reading reports of how many times his vessel had been rammed and sunk by steamers arriving at American ports.

TO SERVE IN PALESTINE

New York, Aug. 23.—Men who enlist in the Jewish battalion of the British army are assured of service in Palestine in a statement issued today by Major C. Brooman White, of the British and Canadian recruiting mission. Denying reports that Jewish volunteers would be transferred on arrival in England to units bound for the front, Major White declared recruits will fight "under the Jewish flag until their services are no longer required."

"I cannot agree that England can now settle the future government of Ireland. She must now govern Ireland despotically till the peace conference, and it would be for her benefit to govern us with a little common sense."

This view that nothing can be done about home rule till the end of the war is also the view of the Unionists, and Wm. Jellett, the most active of the irreconcilable southern Unionists, has put forward his opinion as to the immediate government of Ireland, in much the same sense as John Sweetman.

TORONTO DUE FOR MAJORS.

Toronto, Aug. 23.—Ex-President T. M. Chivington of the defunct American Association, who is a visitor in Toronto, told the Canadian Press today that he was confident that a berth would be found for the Toronto team in a major league after the war. He said it was possible that a third major league, composed of the best clubs in the American Association and the International League would be formed when peace is declared.
