His whose presence was responsible for the incident referred to was an old, grizzled miner, typical of those whom Bret Harte and others have immortalized in verse.



At Circle the interest in the theatricals, after the first excitement had subsided, was renewed and Snow again "Trod the boards in a frenzy fine." But the monopoly he had so far enjoyed in catering to the amusement loving miners was soon to be broken.

The theatrical arena, the Tivoli and Opera House having been destroyed by the big fire, and this year the New Savoy has made its bow to the public. To one who has seen the evolution of the stage from the rude beginning in Fortymile to the present day the transformation is both interesting and amusing.
