REV. J. B. WOODLAND DIED AT WESTBROOK

Former Editor of The Western Chronicle

Amherst, June 5.—Rev. J. B. Woodland, one of the best known Baptist clergymen of the Baptist denomination, died at the home of Mr. Edgar Lewis, West Brook, this evening. Mr. Woodland was taken suddenly ill one week ago yesterday while conducting the regular Sunday service at West Brook, and taken to Mr. Lewis' home. Medical aid was summoned and it was found he was suffering a severe attack of pleura pneumonia. He seemed to rally, and only this afternoon his physician told young correspondents that his chances for recovery were exceedingly good, so that the end must have been most unexpected.

Rev. J. B. Woodland was born at Wallace, this County. He was educated at Acadia College. Being a fluent speaker he first engaged under the auspices of the Sons of Temperance as a lecturer. In 1870 he was ordained at Oxford where he had established a newspaper under the name of the "Sentinel," which was afterwards published in Amherst. He had been engaged in newspaper work and in the Baptist ministry for many years. He was a fluent speaker and a gifted writer and had held many important pastorates in the Western States and Nova Scotia. He was twice married his first wife being a Miss Livingston, sister of J. H. Livingston, ex-M.P.P.; his second wife was an American lady. He leaves besides his wife, one son, holding an important Government position in the United States. He was a man universally respected. A year ago he purchased for himself a home to Southampton, and became pastor of the group of Baptists at that place, Athol and West Brook.

Mr. Woodland was editor of The Western Chronicle for a period and preached in many pulpits in the County. News of his death will be heard with deep regret.
