THE SCOTT TRAGEDY.

The story of the disaster which befell Capt. Scott and four other members of his party when they were returning from the South Pole, makes magnificent reading from an heroic standpoint, but serves to add just one more sad chapter to the terrible toll of splendid lives in connection with polar expeditions.

What could be more pitiful than the story of Capt. Oates of the Inniskilling Dragoons whose feet and hands were badly frozen, and who hoped finally to go to sleep and not awake. He did awake; and then he remarked: "I am just going outside and may be some time," and then he bravely stepped out into the blizzard knowing that it meant certain death but anxious not to further burden his associates.

Or what more heart rending spectacle than that of Scott, who knowing that the four of them were facing the end, continued to write and to utter the plea: "These rough notes and our dead

bodies must tell the tale, but surely, surely, a great, rich country like ours will see that those who are dependent on us are properly provided for."

Maybe this polar exploration business should be stopped. Such trips cannot be taken except at vast expense, and if contributions ceased they would. Even if the North and South poles favored the location of diamonds, or gold, or silver, or coal what would be the use?

Capt. Roald Amundsen, the Norwegian discoverer of the South Pole, has demonstrated, so to speak, that it is only possible to touch the pole a la tag and then scurry back again. Scott sought to stay for observation purposes and he and his companions are no more.

To add to the sadness of it all, the men who go on such ventures are the pick of the best, and the truest and the bravest of their kind. Scott had more than seven thousand applicants from whom to choose his little party of fifty, and other explorers have had a like experience.

The polar regions should be left alone to the bears and the walruses and Penguins; there are big things for fine men to do with some certainty of success, without bothering any more with regions with reference to which the most minute knowledge does not prove of the slightest practical value.

The pastor preached on "What kind of a church a man should join," second in the present series on "Men and the Church." The music was excellent. The choir sang "The choir angelic." Miss Hutchinson sang "There is a green hill far away."

The male quartette composed of Evers, Hills, Russell and Wright sang "Nearer to Thee" by Tenney in excellent union. Three young men were baptized during the service. At the Sunday School and at the evening service more than 500 joined the League of Worship, pledging their attendance when possible at least one of the preaching services on Sunday. An effort will be made to reach the 1000 mark. Next Sunday evening will be observed as "Men's Night" when a special musical service will be carried out as arranged by the pastor and Mr. Wright.

Mr. Brands Farmer of Toronto, assistant teacher to Jan Hambourg, the eminent Russian violinist will play two selections. Mr. Earl Ludlow, baritone of Toronto, will sing "Face to Face" by Johnson and "Fear ye not O Israel" by Buck.

The pastor will speak on "Should Smith Join the Church?" Mr. Goodwin will assist the pastor in the service.

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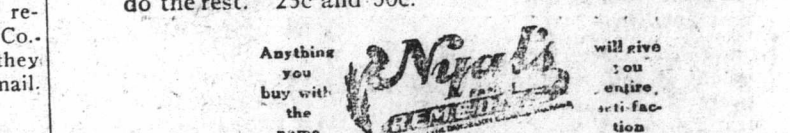
