Steam Barge Resolute Sank in Gale on Lake At Toronto

PREY OF ANGRY WAVES

Toronto, Nov. 23.—One of the worst marine disasters in the annals of Toronto harbor occurred shortly before daybreak yesterday, when the steam barge Resolute went to pieces a mile out from the western sandbar and six of the crew lost their lives. The remaining six, five men and a woman, reached safety efter a terrible battle with the elements. Five were drowned when a lifeboat turned turtle, and the sixth, after clinging to a piece of

Two On Cabin Top.

The first boat was overturned 50 yards from the wreck, and its occupants were engulfed in the icy water. The second boat was brought safely to shore by Capt. John Sullivan, commodore of Contractors Haney & Miller's fleet, to which the Resolute belonged, grimly held on, and was swept through the western gap and rescued in an exhausted condition near the Canadian Shipbuilding Co.'s yards at the foot of Bathurst street.

Crew Desert Vessel.

Unable to make the harbor since Tuesday, owing to the insufficient depth of water in the western gap, the crew, after fruitless attempts to get in, kept the pumps going until the water extinguished the fires. Almost immediately the vessel began to go to pieces, and not until then did the crew desert her. The Resolute had two lifeboats. Into one clambered Chief Engineer Harrison, Dave White, a deck hand; Harry Gregory, a fireman; John Barnes, a fireman. They pushed off just before the Resolute took her last plunge. Into the other gathered Capt. Fahey, Andrew Hicks, a wheelman; Michael Haney, the mate; Ernie McBeth, fireman, and the cook, Elizabeth Callaghan.
