CATTLE MARKETS.

Cables Steady—Cattle Lower—Hogs Firm at Chicago.  
London, Aug. 22.—Cattle are quoted at 10 1/2 to 11 1/2 c per lb.; refrigerator beef, 8 1/2 to 9 1/2 c per lb.

TORONTO LIVE STOCK.

Receipts of live stock at the city market since Friday last, as reported by the rail ways, were 58 carloads, composed of 73 cattle, 627 hogs, 1228 sheep and lambs, about 100 calves, with 11 horses.

Exporters.  
Few exporters were offered and they were of medium quality, and sold at medium prices. The best lot of seven exporters, 1220 lbs. each, sold at \$4.90 per cwt., by Maybee, Wilson & Hall, and these seven cattle were bought for butchers by the Detroit McDonald & Maybee sold three loads of exporters, 1200 to 1310 lbs. each, at \$4.30 to \$4.40 per cwt. There was no such price as \$4.75 reported for export cattle.

Butchers.  
Butchers' cattle were cheaper than at any time this season, especially the common grades. Two picked heifers sold at \$4.35; another lot of three sold at \$4.30 per cwt. The best lot of seven exporters, 1220 lbs. each, sold at \$4.90 per cwt. There were few at the latter price. Medium butchers sold at \$3.50 to \$3.75; common at \$3 to \$3.25; rough and inferior at \$2.50 to \$3 per cwt.

Stockers and Feeders.  
There is a slight demand for feeders of good quality, and a few are offered at \$2.50 per cwt. Stock butchers are in light demand at \$2 to \$2.25 for bulls weighing 900 to 1100 lbs., and \$2.25 to \$2.50 for bulls weighing 1100 to 1400 lbs. each.

Milk Cows.  
Good milk cows and springers are in demand at \$40 to \$50 each; a few prime cows would bring \$60 each, but this kind is scarce. Common cows sell at from \$25 to \$35 each.

Veal Calves.  
Veal calves are still selling at good prices—from \$3.50 to \$5.00 per cwt. Prime calves which are seldom offered, would bring \$3.75 to \$4 per cwt. Such prices were never known on this market at this season of the year before.

Sheep and Lambs.  
There was a bit more for sheep and lambs, and drovers report them hard to buy. Prices were firmer at \$4.15 to \$4.20 for export ewes; bucks and culls at \$3 to \$3.40; lambs sold at \$3.25 to \$3.50 for the bulk, and as high as \$4.25 was paid for some picked lots of ewes and wethers.

Receipts were light, but this did not prevent prices going lower. Mr. Harris reports \$7.10 for select and \$6.85 for lights and fat.

Hogs—Receipts, 4500; steady for good; slow on other; heavy mixed and Yorkers, \$5.40 to \$5.50; pigs, \$4 to \$5.50; roughs, \$3.25 to \$5.50; stags, \$3.50 to \$4.25; dairies and transier, \$3 to \$3.50.  
Sheep and Lambs—Receipts, 600; firm; lambs, \$5.75 to \$6; yearlings, \$5.75 to \$6; wethers, \$5 to \$5.50; ewes, \$4.50 to \$4.75; sheep, mixed, \$2.50 to \$4.75.

Grain Rate Takes a Jump.

Toronto, Aug. 22.—The Grand Trunk have given notice of an advance in local grain rates from points in Ontario to New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Boston and Portland. The increase is two cents per hundred pounds, and takes effect on September 1.

Gooderham's Will For Probate.

Toronto, Aug. 22.—In the Surrogate Court this morning there will be filed the will of the late George Gooderham for probate. It is supposed to be \$3,225,897.42. The succession tax will approximate \$749,500.

Murderer Suicides.

Victoria, B. C., Aug. 22.—Beach, the Mountstickler murderer, committed suicide yesterday by shooting himself in front of his victim's home.
