And now the New York Sun has a three column sensational account of Mr. Stanley's career previous to his becoming an attache of the Herald. This account is of the customary circumstantial character, signed and vouched for as authentic, and professing to be supported by documentary evidence in possession of the writer. According to this Mr. Stanley's career has been that of an adventurous forger and a swindler. Although there seems to be no doubt of the authenticity of the Livingstone letters in England, doubt is still entertained in France of their genuiness. 
