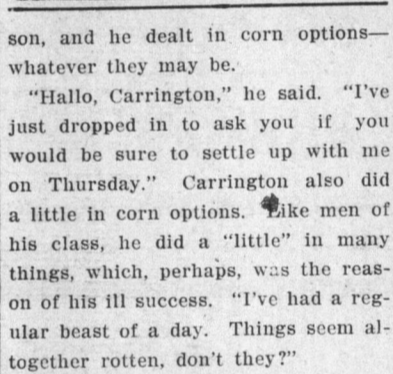
A Child of Sorrow.
