### WANTS NATIONAL LEAGUE.

LONDON, April 16. Lord Robert Cecil, the British authority on a League of Nations, in the House of Commons to-day, said that he hoped the League would be a real League and not merely a League of the Allies to safeguard the future world Peace. He added, "We want not only to secure justice or even security for those who engaged in this war, but to provide means for a general pacification of the world and to secure co operation between all Nations." Lord Robert said it was impossible to exaggerate the economic situation in Europe. He wanted the indemnity question settled and the blockade lifted as soon as possible.
