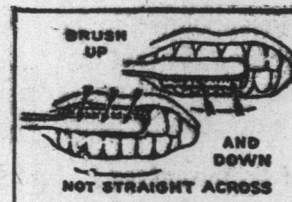

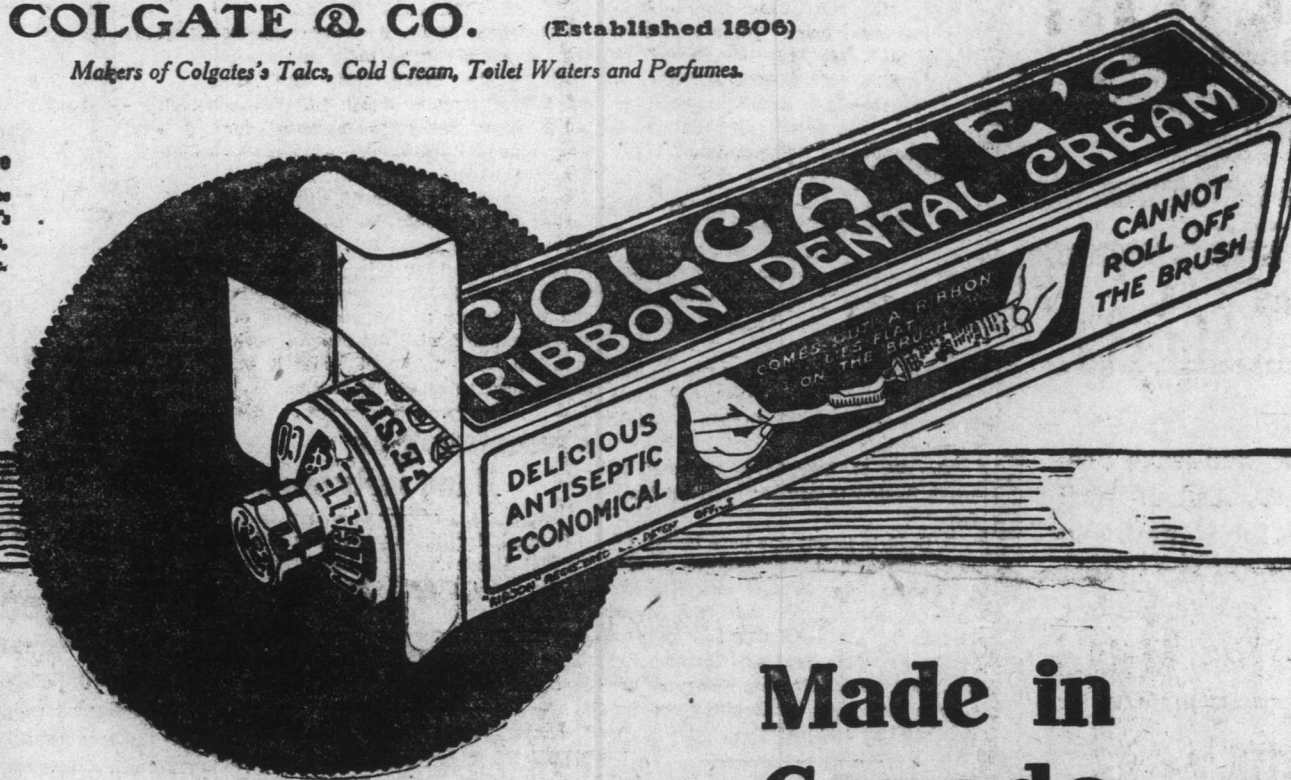

HARBOR MAIN ELECTION TRIAL.

Kelly vs. Woodford.

James Whelan was called and examined by Mr. Mews, cross examined by Mr. Howley, he stated that he frequently called on Mr. Kennedy residing at the wharf. This was in August and the first part of September. He was an opponent of Woodford and Jones in the election. He is a member of the F.P.U. Dr. Mews knew all this when he advanced the payment of \$21.60. He did not remember Dr. Jones saying that when a cheque came from the Board of Works that he should return it. He did not swear that he never saw a cheque, nor that he never signed. Here a pen was handed him and was asked to sign his name. The crossed cheque and signature were in evidence. The Return sheet the witness sent in showed that he had expended \$22.00 the amount of the cheque. He examined by Mr. Mews, Mews stated that he asked for the money before the election was over, because he was afraid that he would get it afterwards. Nicholas of House Cove was next called.

He stated that he stopped a few minutes talking to Woodford and Jones. When asked what the conversation was about, he said that he did not keep a journal of conversations, and did not remember this particular one. Woodford asked witness if he would support him, and he replied "yes." Questioned further, witness said he would say the same to every candidate that would ask him, but who he would vote for lay to his own conscience. He received \$20.00 from Mr. Woodford for working on

the roads, the work to be done where he pleased. Cross examined by Mr. Higgins, witness said he saw Woodford occasionally during the past 36 years and did lots of work. He never took a government sop for the past 10 years. The money has not been used yet, but he will use it in front of his own place, if it is left to his election. He was notified by Mr. Harris not to do any government work between Nomination and Polling days. The money was received before the campaign started. Ter-

rence O'Brien, Topsail, being called, stated he saw Woodford and Jones on Nomination day at Harbor Main. He received \$20.00 last fall. Asked how he got the twenty dollars, he replied, "by working for it." Mr. Mews, "I mean how did you get the work?" Witness, "Oh! Pat Brien got me the work." Mr. Mews, "Where was this work done?" Witness, "Near Snow's Pond." Mr. Mews, "How far is that from Topsail?" Witness, "I don't know, I never measured it." Mr. Mews, "About how far?" Witness, "I said I don't know, and then I don't." Mr. Mews, "What repairs did the road need?" Witness, "I don't know that. I know it wanted to be done, and I did it to my grief." Mr. Mews, "What did you do to the road? Witness, (in surprise) "What did I do to the road? I did nothing to it. I put stones and clay on it." Mr. Mews, "Where did you get paid?" Witness, "at the Board of Works Office, and had a job to get it too." Mr. Mews, "Did you see Mr. Woodford when you went for your money?" Witness, "No." Mr. Mews, "Did you not speak to anybody?" Witness, "I don't know. I have not got it marked down who I was talking to last year. I said I don't remember. So there!" Mr. Mews put some further ques-

tions to which Mr. Howley objected. Mr. Mews protested and said the wit-

ness was hostile. The Court upheld Mr. Howley's objections. A further question by Mr. Mews brought the answer that his head was not a school book and that he did not remember. (No cross examination.) Lawrence O'Brien, Topsail, states he saw all the candidates at Harbor Main on Nomination morning. Held no conversation with Woodford and Jones, except to bid them "time of day." He received \$20.00 last fall, sometime during September. He applied at the Board of Works office for the job. He received his payment after he had worked it out. He received another cheque, but this was for vegetables.

Mr. Mews, "What work were you sent to do?" Witness, "Oh, nothing easy you may be sure." Further examined the witness said that he was putting a bridge across a river at Snow's Pond Road. He sent in his Return Sheet when Mr. O'Neill went out collecting unpaid monies. Cross examined by Mr. Howley he said. This work was of benefit, as without the bridge nobody could cross it. He did not remember if there had been a bridge there before.

Herbert Easton of Manuels, examined by Mr. Mews. I am a voter of Mr. Main and know the candidates

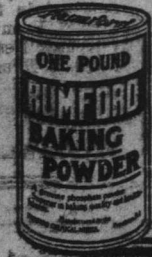
at the last election. Met all the candidates during the election. Got \$110.00 for road work during the year 1919. Went to Board of Works Office and explained about the wretched condition of the road called Rocky Road. Work was done before money was paid. This was a long time before Nomination day. Got paid by cheque. This related to a \$25.00 amount. He got a \$39.95 amount to build bridges on the same road. He built the bridges and got the money when the work was done. It was long before the elections were on. Money was paid by cheque at the Board of Works office. Work was badly needed and road should have been done long before. Didn't know who would be the candidates when work was done.

Court adjourned till 3 p.m.
